WILSHIRE PARK • 315 Sierra Drive

From Highway 183 exit Industrial/157— Turn South on going to your next light which is Signet. Turn right or West going to a stop sign. That stop sign is Wilshire - turn right. Going to Kynette - turn left. The park is on your right about 1/4 mile. Turn right on Sierra Drive and enter the park area.

From HWY 10— enter Euless and turn North on Wilshire Drive. Proceed down Wilshire and turn left on Kynette. Drive down Kynette about 1/4 mile and turn right on Sierra. Enter the park on Sierra.
